

## Scottish Gas Networks (SGN) Perth Road project

SGN are replacing the existing steel/iron mains with polyethylene piping between November 6<sup>th</sup> and February 26<sup>th</sup>. The works extend from the Glen Road at the junction with the Crescent to the 4 Ways roundabout, then Perth Road up to Kippendavie Road terminating at the end of Kippendavie Ave.

The project is in 2 phases:

### **Phase 1 from November 6<sup>th</sup> to December 23<sup>rd</sup>.**

- Starts at 4 Ways roundabout between top of High St and bottom of Glen Rd. Glen Rd will be closed at the junction with 4 Ways during this entire period. Diversions via St Mary's Drive and The Crescent.
- There will be traffic light control at each of the entrance points to the roundabout. The works on the roundabout and first part of Perth Road (up to the junction with The Crescent) will have to stop on December 4<sup>th</sup> due to an embargo by the Council on works during December on Perth Road. On December 4<sup>th</sup> all works will be removed except for the Glen Rd works and diversions above.
- If phase 1 is not completed, then it will restart on January 8<sup>th</sup>.
- There may be 7 day working up to December 4<sup>th</sup>

### **Phase 2 from January 8<sup>th</sup> to February 26<sup>th</sup>.**

- Starts from the junction of Smithy Loan on the Perth Rd up to Kippendavie Rd terminating at the end of Kippendavie Ave. If Phase 1 is delayed as above, then this phase will start when phase 1 ends.
- There will be a rolling program of works. It has not been decided which end will be first. The gas main is under the pavement on the east side of the Perth Rd. The road lane on this side will be closed to enable safe working. Traffic lights will be in place control traffic. The works will be in lengths of between 150 and 200m at a time. (this may vary)

The works do not involve digging up the entire length of road or pavement. The gas main is exposed at intervals, the new yellow polyethylene main is pushed inside the old steel/iron main. Any premises that are connected directly to the old main will be reconnected. There are 'subsidiary' gas mains close to the old main, many premises are connected to the 'subsidiary' which means that these premises will not require reconnection.
